

## THE UNIVERSITY OF LONDON EXTERNAL LAW DEGREE PROGRAMME

The University of London was founded in 1836 and has established its credentials over the years. Its external programme was established in 1858 and it now has 34,000 students currently registered in 180 countries hence making it one of the largest Universities in the world. All students are awarded the same qualifications regardless of the mode or place of study. The University of London is recognized nationally and internationally.

In order to be accepted, applicants for degree courses must fulfil the general entrance requirements. These include:

- Have a minimum age 17 years.
- Obtain passes in two subjects at GCE 'A' Levels
- Three further subjects at GCSE/GCE 'O' Level.
- Fluent comprehension and writing skills in English.
- Satisfy the University's course requirements for that particular degree

Applicants to the LLB must fulfil the general entrance requirements above. LLB applicants with a first degree from an institute acceptable to the University may apply for the Graduate Entry Routes.

### GRADUATE ENTRY TO THE LLB

The following are eligible to apply for graduate entry:

- **graduates holding** a full first degree from a state university in the United Kingdom or another European country or in Australia, Canada, Hong Kong SAR, Israel, Malaysia, New Zealand, Singapore, Sri Lanka, South Africa or the West Indies.
- **graduates holding** a full first degree from a regionally accredited institution in the USA.
- **graduates holding** a full first degree from an Indian Institute of Technology or a four-year, full-time first degree from a recognised university or a three-year, full-time first degree from a limited number of acceptable universities in India

**Note:** Applications from students with other degrees not listed above will be considered at the discretion of the University. Professional qualifications **cannot** be considered for graduate entry
